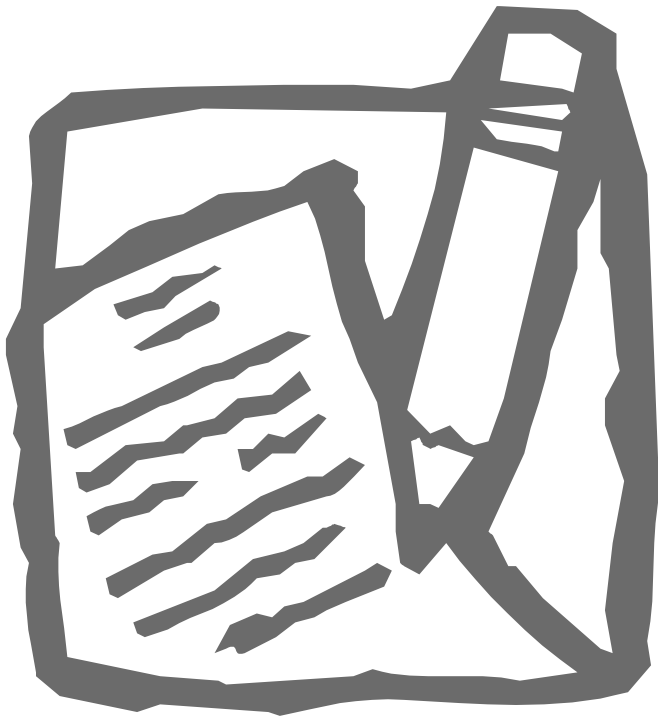
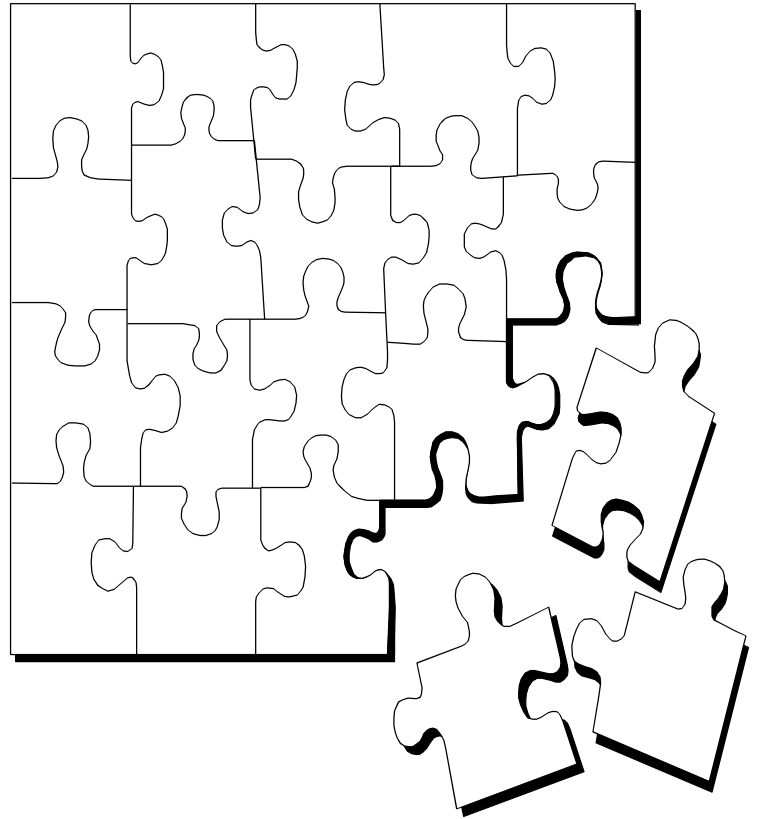


CHURCH ASSESSMENT TOOL

Why take time for a church assessment? Because churches, like people, need an occasional check-up. A picture of how things are now can be of help to church leaders in solving the puzzle of what direction they should take in the future.

To answer the questions will take 30 - 40 minutes. We need every part of the church to respond in order to get a clear picture. If you are a less active participant you may think, "My responses don't matter." Your responses are particularly important. If you are an "every-time-the-door-is-open" person, you may think, "They already know where I stand." Perhaps they do. The computer organizing the answers does not.



The answers will be handled anonymously. No one will see your responses who knows they are yours.

So please return the completed assessment at your earliest convenience. If your church leaders designed additional questions unique to your situation, they are included.

I. YOUR PERSONAL VIEWS AND BELIEFS

In this section of the assessment, we are interested in your views and beliefs in a variety of areas. You will find statements about how you see things in your church community and statements about your spiritual beliefs. Other items deal with the work of your Rector. Still others seek your views about Christian education.

In each case, YOUR impressions, feelings, and opinions are important for church planning. In some cases, you may feel that your opinions are not well informed. Please go ahead and give your impression as it is now, even though you realize it could change by talking with others. Use the "Don't Know" response only in those rare cases where you have no impression at all.

For those statements that begin, "Our Rector...", think of the head of staff. A summary of these items will be given only to your Rector or Vicar to use in planning future growth and development.

In this section of the assessment possible goals are listed for your church in the coming year. If you believe that other ministries require little or no *additional* energy because they are already being performed at an appropriate level of quality, then you would give these a lower score. - _____ 60. Expand the international mission of the church with both financial resources and personal involvement.
- _____ 61. Adapt the opportunities provided by the church making them more accessible given the pace and schedule of my life. (i.e. online education, early morning classes, lunch discussions)
- _____ 62. Work as an advocate for social and institutional change so that society might better reflect the values of the kingdom of God.
- _____ 63. Strengthen the management and support of persons in various ministries so that they are able to do what they do best in work that is meaningful and celebrated.
- _____ 64. Work to renew and revitalize the community around the church by building coalitions with partners that share this vision and commitment.
- _____ 65. Develop ministries that work toward healing those broken by life circumstances.
- _____ 66. Expand outreach ministries that provide direct services to those living on the margins of society. (i.e. homeless, immigrant, transient persons)
